- Slide 5: IHSFC key accomplishments (one or two),
- Slide 6: Area(s) for potential collaboration with other IHSFCs. An “Offer and Ask” slide. What skills, tools, knowledge do you have to offer? What skills, tools, knowledge would you like to ask help from other IHSFCs?

It would be good to show a Center or IHSFC framework to help participants understand how the IHSFC fits into the overall Center to advance its vision.

Since this presentation is relatively brief, the goal is to just give the high-level description to increase awareness of what you do and what you have accomplished.
