2019 Detroit Mini-Grant: Monitoring Local Air Quality

Purpose

The purpose of this program is to support and/or help initiate small-scale projects and initiatives focused on local air quality monitoring within the City of Detroit. X mini-grants will be awarded for up to \$0,000 each.

Eligibility

Eligible organizations must serve residents of Southwest Detroit or be located within the City of Detroit ZIP Codes of 48209, 48210, 48216, or 48217. Researchers applying for the opportunity must have a collaborative partnership with a community organization.

Evaluation Criteria

- Application does not exceed 2 pages (12-point font, single spaced)
- Application demonstrated relevance to local air quality monitoring in Detroit
- Organization designated staff who will coordinate project
- Clear depiction of how the effort will benefit and impact Detroit community
- Description of how funds will help achieve stated goals and stated issue
- Timeline and funding are adequate for applicant
